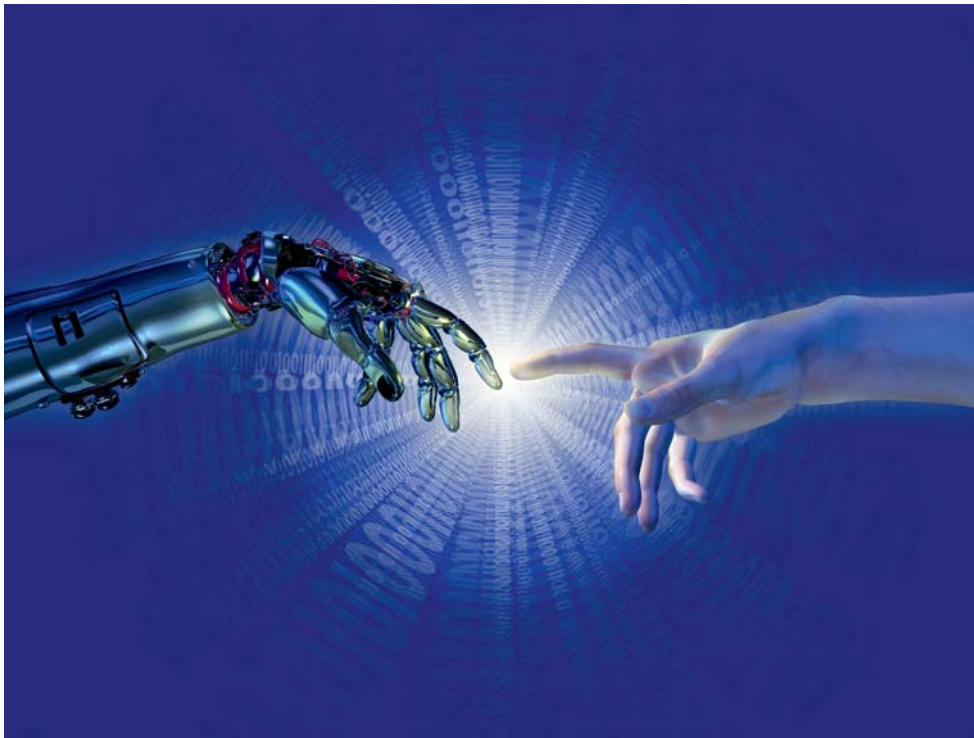
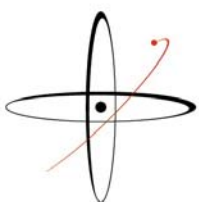

## Being human in an age of intelligent machines

Research in robotics and artificial intelligence has now produced nearly-human machines. What are the implications of this for our understanding of what it means to be human? With robots looking increasingly like humans and able to simulate human compassion, empathy and emotional intelligence what remains of human uniqueness? What are the social and religious implications of these developments?

John Wyatt is Professor of Ethics and Perinatology at University College London. He is co-Principal Investigator for a research project based at the Faraday Institute for Science and Religion in Cambridge, investigating the implications for human self-understanding of recent advances in artificial intelligence and robotic technology. He regularly lectures on topics relating to biomedical ethics and the wider implications of technological advances.
